## MEDAL PLAY

1. Competition consists of ten (10) medal play tournaments among all members (both regular and associate). Flight winners will be determined and trophies or cash awarded at the banquet.
2. Each Ashrose member will be assigned to one of four flights (A, B, C, or D) at the March general meeting. Flight assignments are the responsibility of the Handicap Chairman based on each member's handicap (computed to one decimal place). Any inequity in the number of members in each flight will place fewer golfers in "A" flight first, "B" flight second, and if necessary "C" flight third. Flight assignments will not change during the year regardless of any change in a member's handicap.
3. Within each of the four flights, members accumulate points by competing in as many of the ten (10) tournaments as possible. After each tournament, all players net scores (gross score minus handicap) will be computed and ranked from lowest to highest. Everyone competes "against the field" and points will be awarded as follows:

<u>Position in Field</u>	<u>Points</u>
1st lowest net score	5
2nd, 3rd	4
4 <sup>th</sup> , 5th, 6th,	3
7 <sup>th</sup> through 10th	2
all other participants	1

Ties for 1st, 3rd, 6th and 10th receive the higher bracket point award.

4. Flight champions for each of the four flights will be determined by adding the best seven (7) point scores earned in the ten tournaments to obtain a "final point total". The flight champion will be the member with the highest "final point total". In the event of a tie, the winner will be determined by the following sequence of tiebreakers:
  - a. Most 5 point awards
  - b. Most 4 point awards
  - c. Most 3 point awards
  - d. Most 2 point awardsIf a tie persists, co-flight winners will be honored.
